More specifically, for the admission to the course the Student is expected to have acquired at least 24 credits in one or more of the following scientific-disciplinary sectors (SSD): ICAR/18, L-ART/01, L-ART/02, L-ART/03, L-ANT/01, L-ANT/02, L-ANT/03, L-ANT/04, L-ANT/05, L-ANT/06, L-ANT/07, L-ANT/08, L-ANT/09, L-ANT/10, L-FIL-LET/01, L-FIL-LET/02, L-FIL-LET/04, L-FIL-LET/05, L-FIL-LET/07, L-FIL-LET/08, L-FIL-LET/10, L-OR/01, L-OR/02, L-OR/03, L-OR/04, L-OR/05, L-OR/06, L-OR/07, L-OR/08, L-OR/11, L-OR/16, L-OR/20, M-STO/01, M-STO/02, M-STO/04, M-STO/09, M-GGR/01, M-GGR/02. Students are also expected to have some knowledge of English and basic computer skills. Regardless of the curricular requirements all students are subject to the assessment of their preparation, in compliance with the procedures defined in the Call for Applications. There are no additional learning obligations upon enrollment.</p>
	<p>Assessment methods of student's initial preparation:</p> <p><u>Oral interview</u></p> <p>The verification of the adequacy of a student's preparation is carried out by means of individual interviews aimed at assessing the basic level of knowledge as specified below. The test as well as the overall outcome itself represent a prerequisite for the enrollment in the Level 2 Degree Course in European Heritage, Digital Media and Information Society. Students can do the interview either in person or online (video and audio). Knowledge in the following areas will be assessed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Basic notions of ancient civilizations of the Mediterranean</li> <li>- Basic notions of methods for historical and archaeological research</li> <li>- Basic notions of Medieval and Modern History</li> <li>- Basic notions of Hardware</li> <li>- Basic notions of methods for the representation of information and of file formats</li> <li>- Basic notions of individual-productivity software (one among Microsoft Office, LibreOffice, Apple iWork or similar packages)</li> <li>- Basic notions of software for network communication (web, mail, etc.)</li> </ul>
	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Evaluation criteria for the tests</i></p> <p>Students demonstrating to be in possession of the required basic knowledge in the relevant subjects during their interview are admitted to the Level 2 Degree Course in European Heritage, Digital Media and Information Society and are allowed to attend all the classes within the Degree Course programme. Level 2 Degree Course in European Heritage, Digital Media and Information Society can be accessed without any numerical limitation.</p>

	<u>Note:</u> Candidates will be eligible to take the assessment test of individual preparation provided that the application form, a valid identity document and its photocopy, receipt of the MAV payment of registration fee for the test are provided. The Candidate who will not be in possess of any or some of the aforementioned documentation will be excluded. The use of any electronic device during the test is STRICTLY forbidden in the classroom. Absent applicants will lose their right to do the test. The assessment will consist of an oral test in front of a Commission appointed for this purpose by the Faculty and composed of 3 teachers, who verify the candidate's knowledge in the relevant areas of study. Successful candidates will be allowed to enrol in the degree course. Failure in the assessment test will result in the Candidate not being allowed to enrol. The tests will be in each case preceded by the verification of the requirements as specified above.
